To the Editor:

The AIDS Healthcare Foundation is sponsoring the "Always Hope Affair." This event is a formal event for those who want to help with the fight against HIV/AIDS to come out and show their support.

I can understand why the people of the Golden Eagle community might think this event could bring unwanted trouble to their community. It may attract a wide range of people from everywhere, but I assure the people of the Golden Eagle community that this event will be monitored closely and kept under control. If any disorderly conduct occurs at this event, there will be security there to eliminate the situation before it escalates to anything serious

The Always Hope Affair is in no way encouraging homosexual behavior. This event is only giving those who want to help, a chance to do so. True, HIV/AIDS spreads within the gay community and the majority of the diagnoses comes from gay men, but HIV/AIDS affects everyone. Homosexuals aren't the only ones that can contract the virus, everyone one can. 80 percent of newly diagnosed HIV-positive women contracted the virus through heterosexual sex.

This event has two purposes. The first purpose is to entertain and to raise money. We want our guests to donate money for a good cause while feeling like they are paying for entertainment.

There are approximately 1.1 million people living with HIV/AIDS in the U.S. Since the start of the AIDS epidemic, 1.7 million Americans have been infected with HIV and more than 550,000 have died of AIDS. An estimated 56,300 new HIV infections occurred in the U.S. in 2006. Men who have sex with men account for the majority of new HIV/AIDS diagnoses although gay men comprise only around two percent of the U.S. male population. In 2007, a third of gay men were younger than 30 years old. New HIV diagnoses among gay men are more than 44 times higher than among other men and more than 40 times higher than women. African Americans accounted for 46 percent of new HIV infections diagnosed in 2006, although they comprise only 12 percent of the population. The HIV infection rate among African-Americans is seven times higher than the rate among whites. The infection rate among Latinos is three times higher than the rate among whites. HIV was the leading cause of death for African-American women aged 25-34 years in 2004. The number of women living with HIV has tripled in the last two decades; by 2005, 26 percent of people living with HIV were women. In 2006, 34 percent of all new infections occurred among people aged 13-29—more than any other age group. These are only a few sad fact about AIDS and all of these facts are the reason AHF is sponsoring this event.

The Always Hope Affair is a much-needed event. There have been quite a few AIDS fundraisers that have had tremendous success. The World AIDS Day Event, the AIDS Fund Philly, the World AIDS Orphans Day Event all were successful. They not only met their goal but they succeeded it and added more supporters to the foundations.

The AIDS Healthcare Foundation respects and understands how the people of the Golden Eagle community may feel about the attention the Always Hope Affair might bring to their community but we assure you that this event will only bring positivity to the Golden Eagle community. This event is a much needed event because we need to continue to raise money for the AHF and the people who are affected by HIV/AIDS. And we promise that this event is not to encourage homosexual behavior but entertain the ones who donated money and to help others.

Wow, she's beautiful. She has long golden blonde hair and a smile that lights up the room, but everyone cries when they glance over her gorgeous face. Emily Lockwood was lying in a casket the day after her 30th birthday.

At the age of 28, Lockwood was very a beautiful attractive woman. She could have any guy she wanted. One night at her 10-year high school class reunion, she ran into her high school sweetheart, Adam Lansing. The two rekindled their flame and made a mistake of having unprotected sex without knowing each other's sexual history.

Over the next few months, Lockwood became ill. She noticed she was losing small clumps of hair and she had fever that just wouldn't go away. The smallest task would drain her of her energy and she always had a headache. She finally decided to go to the doctor to see exactly what was wrong with her. The first test the doctor ran didn't show anything. Then the doctor asked Lockwood if she had been tested for any STDs and she had not. Lockwood waited patiently for the doctor to return with her results. After an hour had passed, the doctor walked through the doctor and told Lockwood that had bad news. She was HIV positive. Lockwood broke down in tears, yelling, "How could I have been so stupid?" She knew exactly where she got it from because she had only been intimate with one person the past few months and that was Adam Lansing.

The next couple of weeks Lockwood went into complete depression mode, and she started to become even more ill. She only had a minimum wage job so she was not able to afford the medical treatment and the medication she needed.

The AIDS Healthcare Foundation had an event three months after Lockwood found out she was HIV positive. The event raised money for the AIDS Healthcare Foundation. By the end of the

day they raised enough money to pay for at least 30 HIV/AIDS patients' treatments and medicines, and Lockwood was the last name on the list.

Lockwood started receiving the treatment and medicine she needed and over the next few months she started to get better. She regained most of her strength but the treatment resulted in her losing her hair. Lockwood knew she had to make that call to Lansing to tell him about her being HIV positive but she was regretting it. She finally built up the nerve to call him and when he answered she started to cry. In a weak voice she uttered, "I think you may need to go get tested." Lansing chuckled nervously and said, "Why?" Lockwood said, "Because I got tested and found out that I am HIV positive." Lansing said, "Are you serious" Where did you get it from?" And Lockwood said, "From you, you're the only person I've had sex with in the past two years and we did not use protection!" Lansing got quiet and hung up the phone and Lockwood never heard from him again.

Lockwood got better and returned home and to work. She started living a normal life again. She went to high schools telling students to please be careful when having sex because everyone is at risk. She told her story of how she became HIV positive and she felt as if she was really getting through to the children. She brought bags of condoms and passed them around to the students. She became a huge advocate for AIDS awareness.

One day when Lockwood was at work and she realized she wasn't feeling so well so she went on break and took some of her medication. Thinking that it was probably just something she ate, she went back to work and as soon as she sat down at her desk she fell to the floor. Her coworker, Elaine Proctor called out to her to see if she was ok and when she didn't respond, she walked to her desk and saw her lying on the floor, and immediately called 911. The ambulance came and took Lockwood to the ER, and about 30 minutes later they announced her as dead. Lockwood immune system had shut down on her and she lost her battle to HIV/AIDS.

Lockwood was a beautiful woman but her body could take what the virus was doing to it. Every since Lockwood's death, the AHF has been working double time to help as many people as they possibly can. "We know we cannot help everyone, but that won't stop us from trying," Michael Weinstein, president of the AHF, said.
